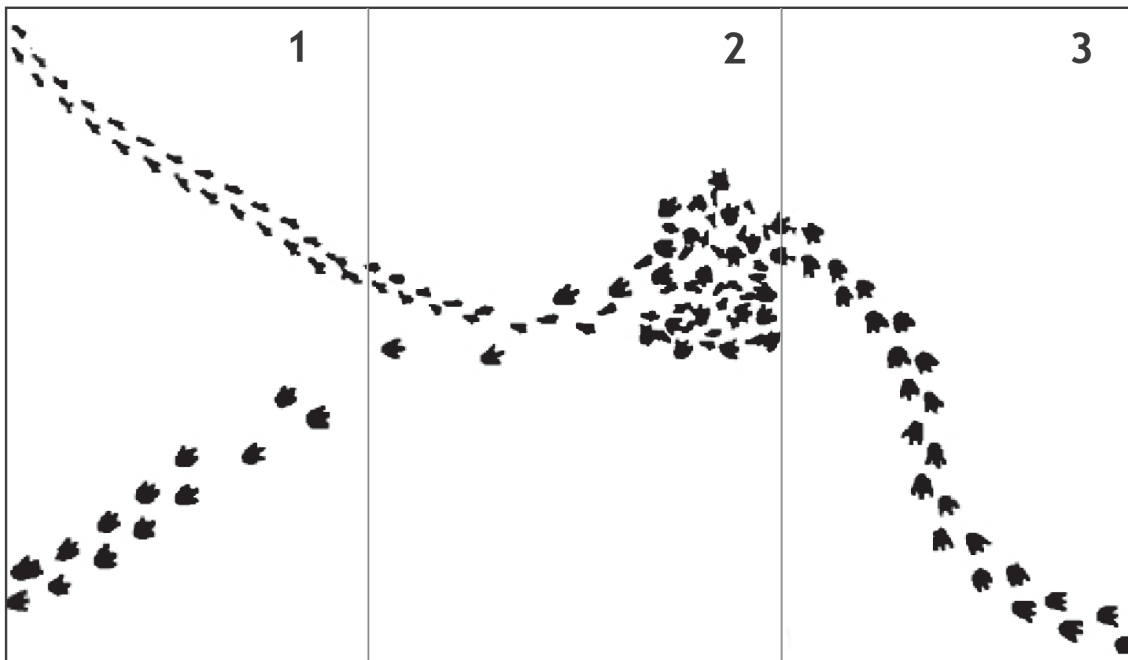

- What pattern of activity do you see?
- What do you think might be the reason for the round indentation in the snow?
- What type of activity do you think the tracks suggest?
